- 2. Capstone presentation slides containing presentation notes will be submitted to program in order to be cleared for graduation.
- 3. Students will present Capstone research project with slides at formal program Capstone Presentations.
- 4. All of the above will be reviewed by Capstone committee to the committee's satisfaction prior to program submission. Committee members will indicate approval to committee chair or faculty advisor prior to student submission.

Students are evaluated through individual meetings with course instructor and committee membership. Any failures in communication or progress will be documented and follow-up plans will be established. Students who choose not to follow prescribed timelines or project requirements will be marked as "Unsatisfactory".
